



The Maine Appalachian Trail Club (MATC) is a mostly volunteer led organization that maintains and manages 267 miles of the Appalachian Trail in Maine.

Caring for and protecting the corridors along the Appalachian Trail is essential. MATC Corridor Monitors walk the Trail and corridor boundary lines looking for timber trespass, trash dumping, illegal motor vehicle crossings, and other encroachments that threaten the condition of corridor resources and reduce the quality of the AT experience. The surveyed boundary itself must be kept clearly visible so that neighboring landowners know where it is, and the regular inspection of boundary line monuments helps to protect against a need for very expensive re-surveys that could be required if monuments are lost.

Corridor monitoring offers an opportunity to get off the AT footpath and explore some incredibly beautiful areas that those who only walk the Trail never see. MATC's Corridor Monitors are looking for individuals to join them for monitoring. Joining a corridor monitor is an excellent way to learn new skills, earn volunteer hours, or add experience to your resume. Even if you are just looking for new trail stewardship opportunities or a chance to explore, we can connect you for a day off the trail with one of our experienced Corridor Monitors.
