



Backcountry and Outdoor Ethics Hike

Safford Notch

Please join us for a Backcountry and Outdoor Hike at Safford Notch!

Backcountry and Outdoor Ethics hikes are an opportunity for new and beginner adventurers of

all ages to explore the Appalachian Trail and become familiar with the seven Leave No Trace principles that guide outdoor ethics.

OPTION ONE: The itinerary for this hike is approximately 5-6 hours long.

Parking: Meet in parking area (15m)

Briefing: What to expect, intro to BOE, and trail etiquette (10m); Hike In (~2.0 hrs)

LNT Activity: Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces (25m)

Participants will explore and discuss various surface types in order make informed and responsible choices while hiking, recreating, and camping.

LNT Activity: How Far is 200 ft (10m)

Participants will try and guess exactly how far 200ft is and why this measurement is important in backcountry and outdoor ethics.

Lean-to for Lunch: Bring your own lunch - *Privies available here* (30m)

LNT Activity: Quiet on the Set (60m)

Lights, camera... bad behavior! We'll be "producing a movie" that teaches others how to behave in the backcountry. In the first take, our actors will perform a scene showing some bad outdoor behaviors. The director will then call "Cut!" and our audience of editors will jump in to rewrite the scene. With guidance from our expert editors, the actors will rerun the scene, but this time, the right way.

Hike Out (~1.5hrs)

Debriefing (15m)

Departure

OPTION TWO: Approximately 2-3 hours long.

Safford Notch Campsite Total Hike: 4.6 miles, 1050ft elevation gain, ~3h 30m Parking: Safford Brook Trailhead, New Portland, ME, GPS: 45.1652, -70.2366
